SAVING LIVES School Meals in India - Tracking State Government Responses to Coronavirus March 2020

Background

The Mid-Day Meal (MDM) is a flagship programme of the Government of India wherein hot cooked meals are provided to school children in classes I to VIII (aged 6 – 14 years) across all government schools and aims at enhancing enrolment, retention, attendance and simultaneously improving nutritional levels among school children.

Under the scheme, each child enrolled in Primary School (Class I - V) is entitled to a hot cooked meal containing 100 grams of food grains per school day and each child enrolled the Upper Primary school (Class VI - VIII) is entitled to a hot cooked meal containing 150 grams of food grains per school day.

As per the National Food Security Act (NFSA), 2013, if MDM is not provided in any school on any school day for any reason, the State Government shall pay a food security allowance (in-kind or cash or both) by 15th of the succeeding month for:

- Quantity of food grains as per entitlement of the child; and
- Cooking cost prevailing in the State.

Summary:


In its letter dated 20th March 2020, the Ministry of Human Resource Development issued a guidance to all States and Union Territories of India, that requested them to provide mid-day meals in schools or dry rations in lieu of cooked meals, or provide a food security allowance in lieu of mid-day meals to school children, wherein the cost of food grains and cooking cost should be transferred to the beneficiary accounts.

As of 29th April 2020, the Ministry of Human Resource Development has issued another guidance to all states and UTs of India, requesting them to continue provision of midday meals or Food Security Allowance comprising of food grains and its cooking cost (or its equivalent pulses, oil etc) in order to fulfil nutritional requirements of eligible children under MDM scheme to safeguard their immunity during the COVID-19 outbreak. 
